The Sacred Heart Church was opened on June 27, 1934 and here we have an interesting foundation stone from 1933, hidden for too long.

"D.O.M" is a Latin abbreviation for "Deo Optimo Maximo" which means "to God, most good (or best), most great"

"Thomas Epus Medioburg"

indicates Thomas Shine, Bishop of Middlesbrough from 1929—1955, "epus" being a shortened form of the Latin "episcopus" for Bishop, and "Medioburg" being the Latin for Middlesbrough

The coat of arms is that of Bishop Thomas Shine.

"Briller Sans Bruler"

was Bishop Shine's episcopal motto, "to shine without burning" an alliteration in French, which plays on his own name.

"Decembris 1933" indicates the stone being laid in December 1933, in fact on the 18th.

"Posuit" (Latin), on the left, refers to the placing, setting or laying of the stone.
